The Hall of Science and Industry shows how glass is made, its properties and some of the thousands of uses are clearly explained through push-button displays, films and demonstrations. In the Steuben Glass Factory hot glass is fashioned into world famous Steuben crystal right before your eyes and you can see master craftsmen and women form, polish and engrave crystal objects. We couldn't leave Corning without visiting the retail store and gift shops.

Having had our lunch at Corning we then headed for Watkins Glen, New York, where we took a boat ride on Lake Seneca. Points of interest on the lake cruise were explained over a public address system. These included the International Salt Company and mines located along the lake, original Indian paintings on rocks and Indian trails.

Boarding the bus once again, we were homeward bound. At 6:45 p.m. we pulled into the Country Cupboard restaurant parking lot at Lewisburg. Here all enjoyed a delicious meal of their choice and a visit to the fabulous gift shops. We arrived back in Perry County by 9:30 p.m. having had a nice and safe journey.

THE PUBLICITY POWER PLAN YOUR PUBLICITY ACTIVITIES

Every activity of your lodge is a potential news story. Your Lodge Meetings. Election and Installation of Officers, visitors, any honors to a member such as veteran pins, any commhnty honors, bingo games, breakfasts, suppers, are just a few examples of what can be publicized. You could even add to this list property improvements, new members, or even membership drives. The list could go on.

Take advantage of your publicity items. One way to do this is to keep an activities calendar. These blank calendars are available in many of the 5 and 10 department stores. Make one up and run off several copies to be distributed among your members. They serve as a good reminder as you go through your year. Look upon it as a tool for maintaining the Lodge functions.

Your press releases or community radio announcements do not need to be lengthy; in fact they should be brief and to the point. I, in my area, am going to look into the possibility of running TV ads via the local area cable station. I understand they run about two dollars a spot. This would be for items to bring the public into the hall.

Remember it's not the length of your publicity; it's the frequency.

DEDICATION OF THE HISTORICAL QUILT AND FRAME

This quilt was dedicated at the Charleroi Presbyterian Church, Charleroi, PA, on Sunday, September 11, 1983, following the Church Service.

History of the Quilt

The Quilt is a gift from Dr. and Mrs. John Blakely. Mrs. Blakely lived in Charleroi as a young girl. She found this quilt in her grandmother's cedar chest. Her grandparents were Mr. and Mrs. J. F. Bowman. They donated this quilt to the church. Information on the quilt indicates it was drafted by Mr. J. F. Bowman and planned and superintended by Mrs. J. F. Bowman. The pattern of the quilt consists of five wheels with a diamond design as a background. The center wheel has the name of the pastors and officers of the Washington Avenue Church which is now the Charleroi Presbyterian Church. The quilt refers to "Rev. G. G. Kerr, 1909," as the present pastor. He was pastor of this church from 1904-1911. This may indicate that the quilt is 74 years old. Rev. J. R. Burson was pastor from 1911-1923. He has "1918" after his name. His name may have been added at that time on the outside of the wheel. The local Masonic Lodge, F. & A. M. 615, The Charleroi I.O.O.F. Lodge each have a wheel listing members. Another wheel has names solicited by Lillian Sterling. Mrs. J. F. Bowman's maiden name was Sterling. This wheel has a dollar sign (\$) in the hub. The remaining wheel is the Protective Home Circle 303 wheel, a fraternal society then, but the Protected Home Mutual Insurance Company now of Sharon, Pennsylvania. The letters S.E.F.P. around this wheel stand for Safety, Economy, Fidelity, and Purity.

The names embroidered in the background diamonds paid ten cents. It is sup-

posed that some of the names in the wheels gave a dollar. There are 1168 names on the quilt. The embroidery work was done by several people with red thread.

Mr. J. F. Bowman was the Superintendent of the Sunday School and the choir director. His daughter, Mrs. Bethel Bowman Jacobs was the church pianist. Her daughter, Mrs. Nancy Jacobs Blakely, presented us with the quilt.

The framing and hanging of the quilt was done by the Evans Frame Gallery of Pittsburgh. It is hanging in the Beckman's parlor of the Church.

**THE PLACE OF THE WOMAN
IN ODD FELLOWSHIP**

The subject "The Place of the Woman In Odd Fellowship" seems to be a static one; what and where is your place? Over there! And there you are; at a position in an Order, fixed to a certain pattern! But by closer examination this place turns out to be very dynamic! Although the word "ORDER" contains a certain discipline and even seems to be rigid for some people, this is not true; to the contrary! Generally speaking, an Order is a society of people committed to certain rules. It is the same with us. Our rules have been placed on record and everybody who wants to join us, must accept them.

But in reality, these rules of words and actions are points of contact for everybody's own inner thoughts. The essence

of our Order is something one has to find out for oneself; you can't describe it, it is a process of inner and mature consideration. Our Order asks for us a constant participation in thinking and acting.

The place of the woman in our Order, well, it has rather changed in times. From men's point of view, women, generally speaking of course, have been a mild kind of virus. She penetrates everywhere, she is becoming more and more self-conscious. In our Order, she acts and contributes in behalf of our aims. How and when did this participation of women in our Order get started? She started as wife or daughter of an Odd Fellow in the America of the early nineteenth century. She did not have any official "Title" and probably she acted by taking care of her husband's "Sunday Best" or by baking a pie for the Brothers. But, in fact, she must have helped with the mission he had been given; help the poor, visit the sick, support widows and orphans. This came within the scope of men and women.

In 1819, the First Odd Fellow Lodge was founded in Baltimore, Maryland. America was a country on the rise, states were formed to be united later into the United States of America. It was a period in which men and women were working together, to the upbuilding of their country.

For both Europe and America, the nineteenth century was a period full of revolution, changes and blood-spilling wars. But it was also a period of discoveries and new ideas, which pushed their way through by force. The abolition of slavery, the rise of women-committees, the work of men like Edison, Rontgen, Marconi, Marx, and Darwin, all this caused a revolution in the minds of people at the particular time.

Do you see them, those first Odd Fellows and their wives with their beautiful bonnets and long skirts, in that turbulent America? There you had to depend on personal courage and issue; there you had to be alert with all fibres of your being! In this sphere, where comradeship was valuable, where you could reach something only by cooperation—in this sphere the circumstances were ideal for an Order, but especially for an Order in which men and women were able to work together, each to their own nature.

In 1851, the wives and daughters of Odd Fellows were given permission to work independently; the Rebekahs were born!

The name Rebekah comes from the Bible, chosen in times when people lived and worked by their Bibles, which words were very important and reassuring in those days. Rebekah, a human being, who knew good and evil, Rebekah, the young woman, who according to the Bible went down to the well and gave water to the stranger, his companions and his animals. Sym-

bolically seen, this means the passing on of something valuable (for water was scarce in this region) but at the same time water means "A life giving element." So we meet here a typical feminine symbolism: "The passing on of Life." She poured water for him, his companions and his animals; this, too, symbolizes charity for people and beasts. Rebekah, a figure of antiquity, with a timeless mission.

The man, who had dedicated himself energetically to the entry of women into the Order was a Grand Odd Fellow. His name was Hon. Schuyler Colfax. He had a dynamic personality and was a good friend of President Lincoln. Later on, when Grant was President, he served as Vice-President of the United States; also he served several terms as Speaker of the House of Congress (one of the few—only two—who ever served as Speaker of both Houses of Congress). As a founder of the Rebekahs, he is justly commemorated by us every year. Although wives and daughters of Odd Fellows could join the Rebekahs from 1851 on, it would take considerable time before every woman could join. This happened in 1894. In the meantime, the Order had spread again from the U.S.A. to Europe. At the end of the nineteenth century we do even find Odd Fellow Lodges in the Netherlands. In spite of some earlier attempts, the first Dutch Rebekah Lodge was "Only" founded in 1920. It was called Hollandia Rebekah Loge No. 1 and this Lodge is still in Amsterdam. A considerable amount of work came within scope for Rebekahs of the nineteenth century. Social work was still in its infancy, poverty was a poignant reality! Even in the twentieth century, before and after the first and second World War, there was a lot to do if you wanted to help the distressed.

But let us look at the present: even now, it has its points to be a Rebekah, maybe more than ever! Although social securities are far better in this part of the world, there are still distressed people who want help. Our horizon has been enlarged by increasing means of communication, besides prosperity doesn't give a solution for sorrow and loneliness. A side effect is, that because less social work has to be done, the mental aspect of the Order increased. Our mission to the outside world, to help wherever necessary is just as timeless as our mission to our inner self, which means reflection and absorption. To propagate positive acquisitions to our fellowmen is becoming in every time. But we need others, too, to discover ourselves. We need to test ourselves; it is the dialogue, the teamwork, that our reflection can deepen, if we rate it at its true values. The process of consciousness that is kept going by our being members of the Order, has a

result in all directions, which are, reflection and action. Our actions must be inspired by the thoughts behind them. The thoughts behind our actions—try to make them perfect. It is an interaction, if it goes harmoniously it will be ideal; but we are very conscious of the fact that most times we act without thorough thinking, or we dream away in our intentions without doing them.

The tension between words and actions define our value towards our work. The way we, members of the Order, and in this case, Rebekahs go, is one of trial and error. We realize that very well, we know that our ideals, spoken about in the temple, are also our obstacles.

The Dutch declaration of intent, drafted by Sisters and Brothers of our Order, represents our efforts in the meaning of the words "To Aim." That declaration of intent states: Odd Fellowship asks the belief in a Supreme Being and is based on the thought that mankind, as rational human beings is responsible for what takes place in our society on earth, that this responsibility practically gets statue by giving Friendship, showing Love and looking for Truth. On this base Odd Fellowship aims to develop those qualities in people which will lead to greater harmony in our society. This will also lead to tolerance for our fellowmen and in the end will bring Brotherhood amongst people. This we try to reach by holding sessions in our Lodges.

Our declaration of intent expresses thoughts and actions. To aim is to be engaged and for Rebekahs of the present it is becoming to think on mental and social areas, it fits in with our general consciousness and with our emancipation. It is important to exchange views with other women about the problems of our time, to disengage ourselves of our families and jobs, to reflect our ideals and thoughts from youth and college-days, and to compare them to the new ways of thinking.

Of course there are many other unions to join, if you want to. We Rebekahs are just one of the possibilities. During the Lodge meetings we should experience something of the inter-action between others and ourselves. By inner reflections we become conscious of the connection between many things, we realize that the other person, as soon as we have a target, fits in, in the mystery of life itself. She belongs to the mosaic of our existence.

It is a great privilege that in our Order Brothers and Sisters have their own Lodges. For everyone and everybody can, to his own disposition, in his own way, reflect on the questions of life, can search for the foundation and connection of all things. It suits us well, that men and women meet on a social base, but we must be aware not to lose our originality, not

to imitate each other but to fathom the human possibilities from our femininity. Our Order values mankind, the unity, which implies man and woman. Our mission contains a masculine as well as a feminine part, action and care. We express carefulness toward our fellowmen.

In every person we find a masculine and a feminine principle (Anima-animus-Jung); and it is the strength of our Order that this has been recognized so early. Our Order appeals to people. We, as women, in the Order, are conscious that we are not only "a woman" but that we especially are human beings, who are to seek a way. We are human beings with our own views, with our own astonishments, we are human beings who have the chance to grow mentally, to look for and to receive opinions. The place of the woman in our Order is dynamic; it is not a place to take roots, to just be there, it is an interaction.

The woman belongs next to the man in order to cooperate with him, she ought to back him up, if possible and she has to lead the way, if she instinctively feels that this is necessary. When the Brothers in our Order act similarly, we reach an interaction. Interaction makes our Order dynamic. It implies movement. If we keep a good balance, our Order will be like a smooth running motor.

We are people on the move and with us many others. We aim for mental adulthood and greater awakening. We are looking for balance, between creating and receiving urges, between change and duration between body and mind. It is difficult to express this, our Order is like a "Dynamic Unit," it is a continuing creation, like life. If we want to express it clearly, we have to use images. The Order teaches us to be ourselves so we use our own imagination.

For Rebekahs it is important that the urge which started our Order in the nineteenth century, is still there. It is good to look back on old treasured values in time of total frankness and to see that our Order still possesses privacy. It is good to discover the values of words and actions which were trusted to us and which are not abandoned.

Rebekah, the young woman from times long passed, who trustfully followed the stranger to her destiny, when she understood this to be her way, obedient to a Supreme Will—this Rebekah continues to live on, in thousands of self-conscious women. Rebekahs from this age want to accept the responsibility for their fellowmen and will also take responsibility for what takes place in society on our earth.
